Introduction

As Israel is widening its air and ground offensive in southern Gaza, the conditions of the thousands of the displaced are getting even worse. With the fighting preventing the distribution of food, water, and medicine, new military evacuation orders squeezing people into ever-smaller areas of the Gaza Strip. As the focus of the ground offensive moves down the Gaza Strip and into the City of Rafah, it is further shrinking the area where Palestinians can seek safety and pushing large numbers of people, many of whom have been forced to flee multiple times, towards the sealed-off border with Egypt. The United Nations says some 1.87 million people — more than 80 percent of the population of 2.3 million — have already fled their homes. Almost the entire population is now crowded into southern and central Gaza, dependent on aid. UN Secretary-



General Antonio Guterres has warned that public order in Gaza could soon break down amid the complete collapse of the humanitarian system.

“The situation is fast deteriorating into a catastrophe with potentially irreversible implications for Palestinians as a whole and for peace and security in the region. Such an outcome must be avoided at all costs.”

Many Palestinians describe the humanitarian situation as catastrophic, stating that it has become a piece of hell amidst continuous fear and terror. The current living conditions in Gaza are marked by extreme poverty, hunger, and scarcity of basic life necessities due to the strict blockade and ongoing bombardment.

In a record time of just 178 days, there have been over 32,000 martyrs, 74,000 wounded, 10,000 are still missing under the rubble, and approximately 75% of Gaza's buildings, including vital infrastructure, have been destroyed.

Project description

The project provided urgent relief assistance to survivors and those affected by the recent aggression in Northern Gaza and Rafah in October-2023. The campaign included the following actions:

1. Providing Food Parcels
2. Food Hospice (Tekiye)
3. Iftar Meals
4. Water tanks
5. Hygiene Kits
6. Flour truck

Logical framework

Goal

- Contributing to protecting the lives and dignity of survivors and those affected by the recent
- aggression on the Gaza Strip and alleviating their suffering

Results

The project managed to achieve the following results:

- Alleviating part of the suffering of the survival and the affected.
- Addressing the urgent needs of the displaced and afflicted, such as food, and wash.
- Joining the effort to save lives by ensuring access to food, water, and Hygiene Kits for those who have lost everything and become internally displaced persons (IDPs).
- Providing Hygiene kits enhancing the overall well-being and dignity of displaced women and girls in Gaza.
- Providing nutritious meals to helps in promoting better recovery and healing for the injuries and reducing the hunger and improving overall public health among affected populations.

Outputs

- 1,100 families of displaced individuals in the Middle area received 1,100 Food Parcels.
- 3 of Food Hospice (Tekiye) were handing out food to the individual in north area.
- 400 families in the Rafah area received 400 Ready-Meals.
- The north area received 10 water tank trucks successfully distributed.
- 2,200 Hygrine Kits, successfully distributed to 2200 individual.
- 25 tons of flour distributed to 500 families in the middle area.

Challenges faced by the project during implementation if any

- The unrelenting humanitarian crisis and looming danger of recurring attacks.
- The huge numbers of displaced weigh heavily on the already strained resources.
- The continuous blockades may hinder fulfilling the project's requirements.
- The logistical obstacles due to the massive devastation and destruction of roads and infrastructure, making it arduous to transport and distribute aid.
- Challenges in Addressing Rafah Border Restriction Policies

How were the challenges addressed?

- By ramping up safety and preventative measures, and prioritizing the security of our team, equipment, and resources in high-risk areas.
- Collaborating with local volunteers allowed for seamless movement, transportation, and delivery of aid to distribution sites in their respective regions.
- Partnering with leading local suppliers and companies guaranteed the acquisition of project requirements while maintaining a well-stocked inventory.
- Establishing positive relationships with local authorities and beneficiary communities ensured that the maximum number of recipients could access our aid.

- Emphasize the importance of sharing information and being updated on the incidents on the ground to be able to support the largest number of the affected communities.
- The challenge of Rafah border restrictions was tackled through diplomacy, aid, and advocacy efforts involving international organizations and local authorities

Beneficiaries

- The displaced families from the hot areas.
- The owners of the demolished houses were prioritized in the project.
- The total number of beneficiaries is 30,500+
- The total beneficiary number is 30,500+, assuming that the average family in Gaza is 5.5 people.
- The beneficiaries, including the elderly, pregnant women, and children, received specific attention and support from the interventions in this project. Measures were taken to ensure their unique needs, such as healthcare, nutrition, and safety, were addressed effectively.
